FPA Australia has a long represented most of Australia's private fire protection firms and has developed strong working relationships with governments and related stakeholders in the interests of its members and community safety. FPA Australia services to its members include networking opportunities, training, continuing professional development, technical advice, accreditation, and policy advocacy.
	The Association is greatly encouraged to see your government's move to provide for a modern and contemporary legislative framework for fire and emergency services. In particular, the inclusion of accreditation requirements for the preparation of 'Bushfire hazard documents' (s43, s44 and s45) is most welcome. You may be aware that FPA Australia manages a Bushfire Planning and Design (BPAD) accreditation Scheme (the Scheme) in New South Wales, Victoria and Western Australia. The Schemes are run in close collaboration with the relevant jurisdictional land use regulators and fire services and provide for a rigorous process of accreditation, professional development, audit and complaints. You can find more information about it on our website here. FPA Australia would like to see the Scheme extended to Tasmania, or at least a means of mutual recognition invoked. Encouragingly, our review of the proposed legislation seems to indicate that the Bill provides for both, depending upon the nature of subsidiary regulations and supporting policy.
	FPA Australia would be pleased to engage with your government and relevant agencies when the Bill in its current form becomes law, as we hope it will.
